

Safety Officer input.

You have all heard the saying" Keep the shiny side up and the rubber side down". Well this time of year we need to pay special attention to the tire pressure, the air temperature going down tends to pull some of the tire pressure with it. Just a few pounds of tire pressure can make a big difference in the handling of your bike.

T.C.L.O.C.K.

Tires. It only takes a few minutes to check the pressure. Spokes/wheels.

Controls. Make sure they are in good working order.

<u>Lights</u>. You will want to be seen so make sure your running lights are on and your brake light works.

Oil & Gas. Always check your oil before you ride, and running out of gas is not fun.

Chain/belt & Chassis. A quick look can detect a problem with alignment.

<u>Kickstand</u>. The spring needs to hold it up and out of the way. (Sidecars and Trikes can do without them.)
